ORDINANCE NO. 162***

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WHITE, SD, AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY BY AMENDING SECTION 2.02, WARDS AND VOTING PRECINCTS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF WHITE, SD:

Section 1. That Section 2.02 of the Municipal Ordinances of White, SD, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECT.2.02 WARDS AND VOTING PRECINCTS

Wards and Precincts. The City shall be divided into three wards, which shall be combined and consolidated into one election precinct, and shall be designated respectively as Wards One, Two, and Three. A map illustrating the boundaries and location of each ward is kept on file with the Finance Officer at City Hall.

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First Ward will encompass that portion of the City lying south of the center line of East Second Street to the center line of East Sixth Street, and all that part of the City lying east of the center line of Hooker Avenue between the aforementioned boundaries.

Second Ward will encompass that portion of the City lying north of the center line of West Main Street to Hooker Avenue and west of the center line of North Hooker Avenue to Second Street, and all that part of the City lying north of the center line of East Second Street.

Third Ward will encompass that portion of the city lying south of the center line of West Main Street to Hooker Avenue, and that portion lying west of the center line of South Hooker Avenue to Fifth Street, and that portion lying south of the center line of East Fifth Street to the outer boundaries of the City.
