They voiced concerns on how uninviting the hall appeared the way the White Community Club had set up the night of the street dance and asked if they could expand their temporary beer license to include liquor and they would take care of serving at the dance.

Council person Wayne Kelm discussed having trees checked in the city boulevard to see if they were hollow and if so have them removed.

Motion by Wilts, seconded by Gladis to approve the building permit for Bobby Punt. Motion by Wilts, seconded by Cutler to approve \$3500.00 for Dan DeYoung to purchase a new locator. Motion by Hopfinger, seconded by Cutler to move into executive session with the White Community Club at 8:02 pm. The council came out of executive session at 8:31 pm. Motion by Hopfinger, seconded by Cutler to move the next regular meeting to Monday, September 9, 2019 at 7:00 pm. Motion by Gladis, seconded

by Kelm to move into executive session at 8:35 pm. The council came out of executive session at 9:27 pm. Motion by Kelm, seconded by Hopfinger to adjourn.
