

The White City Council hosted a Special Meeting on Monday September 29th, 2025, at the McKnight Community Center. Mayor Lagerstrom called the meeting to order at 7:00PM. Roll call was taken, council members were present: Wright, Cutler, Sunderland, McManus, Haines and Willmott. Guests for the evening were Cedric Hay representing Banner, Loren McKinney, and Kathy McKinney. All motions are unanimous unless otherwise noted.

Mayor Lagerstrom began the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by roll call.

Motion by Wright, seconded by McManus to accept the agenda as presented.

Motion by McManus, seconded by Wright to approve the minutes from the September 16th, 2025 Special Meeting Minutes.

Motion by Sunderland, seconded by Wright to approve the bills as noted on the Claims Register.

The Floor was opened for Public Comment, none were received.

Kathy McKinney asked if there has been an open house for the new fire hall. Mayor Lagerstrom noted that there hasn't been any open house for the city residents to walk through. He noted that he would talk to the Fire Chief and see what he can about having an open house. Kathy also asked why 4th street was being ripped up again. Cedric Hay answered that question for Kathy. He said that during their checks last year they noticed that it wasn't poured evenly. Cedric said that if it wasn't fixed that the city might get 10-15% life out of it. Kathy then said who has to pay for this. Cedric said the contractor does since it was their mistake.

Cedric talked to the Council about the Tap Grant that the City has applied for. The City of White proposes the construction of 3,400 feet of sidewalk located along 5th Street and also includes some sidewalk in the City Park. This project will improve the accessibility from the business district on Main Street, the school to the football field, track, and baseball field. The proposed project will also improve the accessibility and connectivity between residential areas to City of White and Deubrook Area School facilities. It will also improve the accessibility throughout the City Park. This project will address the safety concerns by providing an adequate route for pedestrians that is not currently along the edge of the roadway. Cedric has help put the Tap Grant application together. He wanted to make sure that the Council had no further questions before the application is submitted on Wednesday Oct 1st.

Resolution 2025-06 states that the Council approves the submission of the Tap Grant application requesting \$596,018.79 of funding for the eligible costs for the proposed project. Motion made by Sunderland, seconded by Cutler to approve resolution 2025-06.

The match letter states that the city is planning to match \$131,276.86 which would be the minimum 18.05%. The City will budget for this or will use unrestricted funds. Motion made by Sunderland, seconded by McManus to approve the Match Letter.

Motion made by Sunderland, seconded by Wright to adjourn the meeting at 7:26pm.
